# **Endgame Studies 5-8**

Sunday afternoons Eastern Time – easier for chess players outside the US to participate!

The 4 classes outlined below are part of the ongoing online program *Endgame Studies*. Sign up for only \$75 for 8 hours of chess training!

**Format**: In all endgame classes, there will be 1 hour of presentation, then  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour with puzzles, followed by the last  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour with feedback on the puzzles.

The puzzles for this class, together with the *Zoom* Meeting link, will be emailed out to the participants shortly before the class. Afterwards, I will follow up by sending out a raw database of the material used in the class.

## Sunday, May 31 at 2-4pm (ET).

Class 5: 2 bishops + knight vs. rook + pawn.

A famous theme among study composers. The piece configuration of 2B + N will prevail against the rook under normal circumstances, even if a pawn is added to the rook side. However, circumstances are usually not normal in studies, and a far-advanced pawn or the clumsy placement of minor pieces can make the picture more complicated. We shall look at some great examples within this theme.

## Sunday, June 7 at 2-4pm (ET).

Class 6: Favorite endgame studies.

A collection of my favorite endgame studies. No particular theme or piece configuration is covered, just the best among the studies I have come across over the years. I will, however, try not to choose very famous studies that I suspect that people already know.

## Sunday, June 14 at 2-4pm (ET).

Class 7: 2 Bishops vs. knight + pawn.

An intriguing endgame where the side with the 2 bishops are able to mate the knight side in most cases, but with perfect play it often takes more than the required 50 moves. The addition of a pawn can complicate matters, and in this class we shall see some great escapes and beautiful ideas and mates. As part of this class, I will also outline how the bishop side is aiming to win according to endgame theory.

#### Sunday, June 21 at 2-4pm (ET).

Class 8: Introduction to the work of Alexey Troitzky.

Troitzky is one of my favorite composers. The main reason is the close connection of his studies to endgame theory. At times, he can go to extremes in his studies to show a point – for instance how a correct move-order can lead to a winning 2N vs. pawn that would otherwise be drawn. But mostly, his studies are closely connected to endgame theory and display many beautiful and instructive ideas. This class will be based on his *Collection of Chess Studies (With a Supplement on the Theory of the End-Game of two Knights against Pawns)* – without going into specifics about the 2N vs. pawn endgame.
