Endgame Studies 25-28

Please note: For the foreseeable future, all 3 online programs will run on Mondays only. The time is Monday 7-9pm EDT as always, and the programs will run in turn. One program consists of 4 classes.

The 4 classes outlined below are part of the ongoing online program *Endgame Studies*. Sign up for only \$75 for 8 hours of chess training!

Format: In all endgame classes, there will be 1 hour of presentation, then $\frac{1}{2}$ hour with puzzles, followed by the last $\frac{1}{2}$ hour with feedback on the puzzles.

The puzzles for this class, together with the *Zoom* Meeting link, will be emailed out to the participants shortly before the class. Afterwards, I will follow up by sending out a raw database of the material used in the class.

Monday, December 28 at 7-9pm (ET).

Class 25: 1-2 pieces chase the king around (Part 2)

We will continue our exploration into positions where 1-2 pieces chase the opponent's king around on the board. This time, I will combine this theme with studies where 2 (or more!) same-colored bishops are present. Again, I will rely heavily on Troitzky, but other composers will also have their say.

Monday, January 4 at 7-9pm (ET).

Class 26: A study composer's finest moment! (Part 5)

In this class, we shall delve into themes based on composers. I have mainly chosen smaller, but famous themes that hasn't been overly copied by other composers. But they are still this composer's finest moment! We will look at famous names and composers that are less known. Exceptional composers such as Alexey Troitzky may have more than 1 theme.

Monday, January 11 at 7-9pm (ET).

Class 27: A study composer's finest moment! (Part 6)

In this class, we shall delve into themes based on composers. I have mainly chosen smaller, but famous themes that hasn't been overly copied by other composers. But they are still this composer's finest moment! We will look at famous names and composers that are less known. Exceptional composers such as Alexey Troitzky may have more than 1 theme.

Monday, January 18 at 7-9pm (ET).

Class 28: Kb3 vs. Kb1, rook versus queen works!

Allowing pawn promotion to a queen on a1 doesn't normally work with the setup Kb3 vs. Kb1 against a rook as the queen can get up the a-file and control squares on the 1st rank. However, there are exceptions - and in this class, we will explore them all. Some of the studies involved are closely connected to endgame theory, whereas others are further away but with pretty ideas.
