

## Endgame Studies 1-4

Sunday afternoons Eastern Time – easier for chess players outside the US to participate!

The 4 online endgame classes are part of one package. Sign up for only \$75 for 8 hours of chess training! Below is a description of the 4 classes.

**Format:** In all endgame classes, there will be 1 hour of presentation (with questions), then ½ hour with puzzles, followed by the last ½ hour with feedback on the puzzles.

The puzzles for this class, together with the *Zoom* Meeting link, will be emailed out to the participants shortly before the class.

**Sunday, April 26 at 2-4pm (ET).**

Class 1: *King, bishop and knight mate.*

This theme has found its way into many fascinating studies, especially those where the defender has an opposite-colored bishop but is nonetheless helpless. Attacks with OCB can also work with heavily reduced material. We will look at some great studies, but also analyze positions from real games with this 'study-like' theme.

**Sunday, May 10 at 2-4pm (ET).**

Class 2: *Famous themes in studies.*

We will pick famous themes that many studies have been modelled over. Examples are the Reti and Amelung themes, just to name a few. A well-worked theme can work across many different piece configurations, as we shall see in this class.

**Sunday, May 17 at 2-4pm (ET).**

Class 3: *Studies based on fortresses.*

There are a bunch of fortress positions that are, or should be, an important part of your endgame knowledge. In this class, I will showcase these fortresses and show how they have been used in studies.

**Sunday, May 24 at 2-4pm (ET).**

Class 4: *Rook vs. pawn – funny movements up and down the board.*

When a rook fights a far-advanced pawn, it can lead to funny movements between the rook and the opposing king in the quest to promote/stop this pawn. A variety of typical tricks appear from such positions, and we shall have a look at them in this class.
